
Our Prevention First programs empower children to successfully handle everyday life situations and extraordinary challenges such as substance use, harassment, intimidation and bullying.

Revenue



Grace's Road to Security

Grace, a senior from southern
Ocean County, was struggling
financially and emotionally. She was
overrun with bills and challenged
with debilitating anxiety. While she was

being served a summons for shoplifting less than \$50 worth of food, the local police recognized she needed help and directed her to our Justice Involved Services Program. The first priority was resolving the court issue, and her case manager went with her to court, met with the Prosecutor and helped her set up a payment plan to repay her fine. Then, other challenges were tackled including applying for emergency rental assistance, securing food benefits, receiving regular mental health treatment, and more. In her words: "I am so grateful; if I didn't have Preferred in my life, I don't know where I'd be. Everyone has hearts of gold."

Maya's Road to Healing

Following an attempt to end her own life due to severe depression, Maya joined the SAIL program.


SAIL is a 5-day a week, structured, intensive after-school program. In her

words: "My therapist Julie is my favorite person in the world; she validated my traumas and broke them down for me to help me understand; she did everything in her power to make me feel safe, and she will always be a role model for me as she changed my life in just a span of a year." Maya graduated from SAIL in July and is thriving as a junior in high school in Ocean County. She is volunteering as a Teen Advisor for a mental health text line and plans to attend college for Criminal Psychology. Maya's story is not over, and the best is yet to come!

Stephen's Road to Independence

"In 2019, I didn't have a life; I was a hermit and recluse. I didn't go out, I became depressed and started drinking and even my family didn't want to see me. I met Shannon and she brought me hope." Shannon is Stephen's case manager with our Integrated Case Management Services program. Together, they worked on finding a better apartment, financial planning, applying

for food and health benefits, and finding a job. Today, Stephen continues to receive mental health treatment and other supports, and is much happier. He sees his family a few times a month and goes out regularly with friends. "I appreciate getting the extra support from PBHG for the last few years during the pandemic; it has helped me so much. Thank you!"
